Responsibilities

The Education Outreach Coordinator will provide daily logistical and programmatic support for education programs, including but not limited to the following activities:

- Collaborate with Education Staff, teaching artists, and program team to coordinate short-term and long-term professional development programs for classroom teachers
- Facilitate workshops and in-services
- Manage select professional development programs
- Manage Childsplay's portfolio of Classroom Experiences
- Create project support materials
- Create and maintain program calendars and teaching schedules
- · Prepare and monitor monthly department budgets, including invoicing and payroll
- Collect and track data related to Childsplay programs
- Provide content and logistical support for teaching artists
- Cultivate ongoing relationships with new and returning teachers, administrators and other school staff
- Other duties as assigned

- Two or more years of experience and/or training as a teaching artist
- BA degree in a related discipline i.e. theatre, education, non-profit management or equivalent
- OR equivalent combination of education and experience
- A car and be willing to travel to schools around the Phoenix area
