***Rock Paper Scissors:*
Childsplay Hands the Valley a World Premiere!**

Tempe, AZ – Childsplay, Arizona's professional theatre company for young audiences and families, continues its 2008-2009 season at the Tempe Center for the Arts with its innovative and cutting-edge production, ***Rock Paper Scissors***. Directed by Corey Madden, this play is a contemporary re-imagining of the Master/Apprentice relationship. ***Rock Paper Scissors*** opens in the Studio at Tempe Center for the Arts on Saturday, February 28 at 4 p.m. and runs through Sunday, March 8. There will be a Target Storybook Preview on Saturday, February 28 at 1 p.m.

Created through a collaboration between Childsplay, and a Los Angeles-based team of Corey Madden, Laural Meade and Keith Mitchell, ***Rock Paper Scissors*** explores 21st century storytelling as two comic characters get caught in a conflict between 'analog' and 'digital' culture. In this brand new theatre event filled with games, visual images, music and sound, a master craftsman and his young protégé grapple with their colliding creative styles as they try to live and work together.

Rock Paper Scissors was made possible through the Multi-Arts Production (MAP) Fund with local support from SRP. The MAP Fund is a program of Creative Capital supported by the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation and the Rockefeller Foundation. Childsplay is the recipient of a \$27,000 grant for new works in live performance. Of more than 600 proposals, Childsplay was one of only 38 projects to receive this highly coveted support for the development of its 2009 world premiere of *Rock Paper Scissors*. The grant helps develop and support the show, while the donation from SRP supports school touring of this production.

About the MAP Fund -- The Multi-Arts Production Fund was created by the Rockefeller Foundation in 1988 to support innovation and cross-cultural exploration in theatre, dance and music. Among the longest-lived programs in arts philanthropy, Creative Capital has administered MAP since 2001. In 2008, the program became the recipient of a three-year, \$3.3 million support grant from the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation.

The **Target Storybook Preview Performance** will be on Saturday, February 8 at 1 p.m. with general admission tickets discounted at \$12. Tickets for all other performances are \$18. Additional box office fees may be charged. Tickets are currently on sale.
