Duration:

Summer Academy Assistant Teacher is a seasonal, hourly position, Monday- Friday during the camp dates. The 2021 Summer Academy mandatory training is Saturday, May 22nd, and the camp operates from June 1st- July 30th (no classes week of July 5th- 9th). Ideal candidates have limited conflicts during this period. Opportunities are available to assist with in-person programs at Childsplay's Campus in Tempe.

Job Summary:

Under the supervision of the Academy Director, Assistant teachers work alongside Childsplay Teaching artists to supervise, support and facilitate drama-based classes for students ages 4-15. Key responsibilities include (but are not limited to): supervising students, preparing materials needed for classes, participating in planning for lessons, facilitating theatre activities, and supporting courageous and inclusive classrooms.

An Academy Assistant Teacher is Responsible For:

- 1. Collaborating with teaching artists and student interns to plan daily activities.
- 2. Supporting the development of inclusive learning environments which protect physical and emotional safety for participants
- 3. Assisting teaching artists with facilitation of activities
- 4. Supervising students during lunch, bathroom breaks, and extended care
- 5. Preparing materials for classes, including art supplies, worksheets, and photocopies.

Required Skills and Qualifications:

- Desire to work with young people and foster a life-long love for performing arts.
- Current Arizona Fingerprint Clearance Card (or ability to obtain credential before beginning work)
- Interest in the performing arts
- Commitment to establishing learning spaces that center equity and inclusion.
- Minimum of 18 years of age
- Flexibility and a positive attitude essential

Additional Valued Skills and Qualifications:

- First Aid/CPR certification
- Administrative and/or customer service experience
- Theatre Training or Experience
- Experience working with young people
- Experience working with specific student populations such as ELL, special needs, individuals with autism, etc.

Salary: \$12.50- \$14 an hour depending on the program
