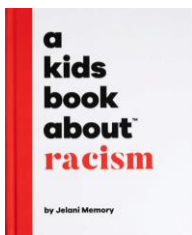


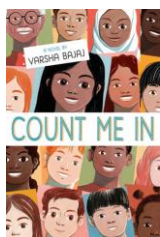

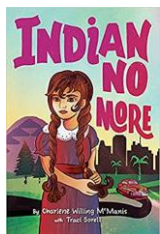
Front Desk (2019)

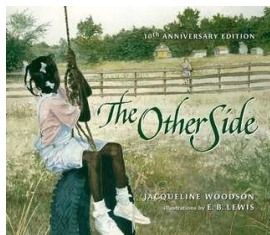
Indian No More (2019)

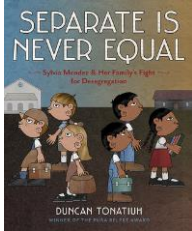
Other Side (2001)

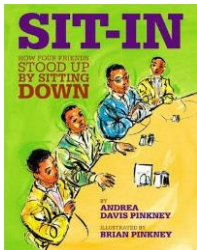
Separate is Never Equal: Sylvia Mendez and Her Family's Fight for Desegregation (2014)

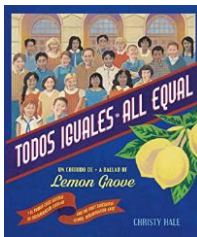
Sit-In: How Four Friends Stood Up by Sitting Down (2010)
