



# The End of the Beginning: Being the Adventure of a Small Snail (and an even smaller <u>ant)</u> (2004



# Narwhal: Unicorn of the Sea (2015








### Little Robot (2015) By Ben Hatke


# Toys Go Out: Being the Adventures of a Knowledgeable Stingray, a Toughy Little Buffalo, and someone called Plastic (2006)



By Jeff Smith


