

Director of Education and School Programs — Overview

Childsplay seeks an individual ready to take a leadership role in the field of arts education to serve as our Director of Education and School Programs. This position guides all school-based activities and serves as the project director for Childsplay's award-winning, evidence-based professional development, in-school and community residency programs. This individual will take a leadership role in current research-based grants from the U.S. Department of Education and will be responsible for the strategic development and growth of current and new education and community programming. The position manages a \$1 million revenue goal for school-based programs including field trips, in-school performances, and residencies and oversees our School Programs team. A successful candidate will demonstrate strong skills in spearheading school and community partnerships, an extensive background in program and curriculum development, a passion for big-picture thinking combined with the ability to implement new ideas, an abiding curiosity and love of learning and research, and true joy in creating drama with young people.

This role is part of an ensemble that celebrates learning and creativity, encourages innovation, and provides multiple opportunities for professional growth. The work at Childsplay is fast, furious and extremely rewarding. We offer a terrific family environment and the fulfillment of working for a company with a mission to improve the lives of young people through the arts.

Childsplay is currently on a strategic journey with the goal of becoming a bilingual, culturally inclusive theatre by 2030. Director of Education and School Programs — Responsibilities and Qualifications

Responsibilities

The Director of Education and School Programs is a full-time, exempt position. It leads the design and implementation of all school and community-based programs, including but not limited to the following activities:

- Serve as a leadership voice within the organization, providing expertise from the perspective of schools and community investment in all strategic and programming conversations
- Implement and develop strategies for expanding and scaling Childsplay's evidence-based professional development programs (EYEPlay and Drama Frames)
- Spearhead current and new research grants in partnership with the Associate Artistic Director and Arizona State University and participate in the development and execution of research protocols
- Implement existing and develop new school and community-based residency programs
- Oversee the development 360 degree programming to support and extend school performance experiences (e.g. curriculum guides, talk-backs, etc.)
- Manage a \$1 million revenue budget for school programs (inclusive of field trips, in-school performances and residencies)
- Supervise the Education Programs Manager, School Booking Coordinator, and Teaching Artists

- In partnership with the Marketing team, develop and implement marketing strategies for all school-related programs, including field trips, in-school performances, and residencies
- Commit to participating in and guiding the evolution of Childsplay, and specifically its school and community engagement programs, as we journey towards becoming a bi-lingual, culturally responsive theatre
- Other duties as assigned

Qualifications

The ideal candidate will possess

- A passion for education, theatre, and Childsplay's mission as well as a healthy sense of humor
- A deep understanding of arts integration and the current education landscape
- Extensive experience in program and curriculum development
- Demonstrated ability to build and sustain community and school partnerships/relationships
- A passion for research, learning and reflective practice
- Experience in leading professional development programs
- An understanding of SEL Learning best practices
- An understanding of digital education models
- Supervisory experience
- Strong writing, communication, and computer skills
- Eight or more years of related experience, BA degree in a related discipline (e.g. theatre, education, non-profit management) OR equivalent combination of education and experience
- Ability to travel independently to schools around the Phoenix area
- A valid driver's license and fingerprint clearance card are required

Optional, but beneficial:

- Specialty or interest in early childhood education
- Fluency in Spanish (speaking and writing)
- Experience in designing and implementing research studies
